



# **Appointment of Post-Doctoral Researcher**

The Leibniz-Institute for Research on Society and Space (IRS) in Erkner (close to Berlin) is a publicly funded non-university research institution and a member of the Leibniz Association. The IRS is looking for a

for its Research Group "Creativity and Space" of the IRS Research Area "Economy and Civil Society". The position is to be filled as soon as possible and is initially limited to four years.

### **Working Context:**

The research group 'Creativity and Work' is interested in the contribution of creative and (social) innovation processes to socio-economic transformation processes in urban and rural regions. Megatrends such as demographic and climate change contribute to the increasing complexity of global-local interdependencies in digitally mediatised contexts. These dynamics are reflected in societal challenges and is changing trans-local economic and social interactions. Against this backdrop, the research group examines civil society and entrepreneurial approaches to dealing with uncertainties, disruptions and diverging visions of the future in creative and innovative processes. In doing so, it explores collaborative, sometimes conflictual negotiations of value attributions in these processes and investigates new forms of trans-local action by actors. In doing so, alternative forms of organisation, such as collectives, cooperatives, or public welfare-oriented companies at the interface of market and non-market logics, are increasingly becoming the focus of the research group's activities. The aim is to develop options for shaping open regional innovation and economic policies. The research contributions are predominantly located in human geography, but are interdisciplinary in nature.

Working in the Research Group offers the opportunity to develop and implement your own qualification track for building a postdoctoral career path towards becoming eligible for a professorship. The IRS provides a research context that supports the development of necessary core competencies, for example through participation in the conceptual and empirical phases of projects in the current research programme. Project involvement is provided through the flagship project 'Caring – Valuing – Transitioning'. The project examines mission-oriented organisations that develop alternative economic or civil society solutions to shape what they see as a better future. The position also offers the opportunity to sharpen your research profile by applying for, managing and implementing your own third-party funded research projects and to gain experience in project and staff management and research management. To this end, the IRS supports national and international networking within the scientific community and at the same time offers space for knowledge transfer initiatives.

### Your tasks:

- Participation in the entire research process of the above-mentioned flagship project (including preparation, planning, implementation and evaluation of empirical work),
- Developing your own profile for the postdoctoral career phase towards an eligible for appointment to a professorship, e.g. by:
  - Participation in application activities for the acquisition of third-party funding for the research group,
  - o Publication of research results in peer-reviewed international journals,
  - Presentation of research results at national and international scientific as well as transfer-oriented events,
- Active involvement in the development of transdisciplinary working formats.

## Your profile:

- Excellent doctoral degree in human geography (focus on economic, social, urban and regional geography), spatial sciences, organisational sciences or other disciplines with a spatial focus,
- Knowledge of empirical social research methods,
- Knowledge of literature and theory in at least two of the following fields: knowledge, digitalisation, spatial theories, valuation theories, post-growth economies, alternative economies, transition theory,
- Knowledge of new spatial, organisational and social forms of economic activity,
- Experiences in publishing in peer-reviewed journals and presenting research work,
- Independent working style, openness to interdisciplinary collaboration and very good written and spoken English skills.
